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President's Report 2024-2025

Introduction

I feel very privileged to have been President over the last 2 years and thank the Management Committee for their support in their various rolls over that period.

On behalf of the Management Committee, I would like to thank the membership for their ongoing support and work in the growing and developing of BTC.

The voluntary help by you the members is what makes BTC such a successful sporting club.

Financial status

BTC has had a good 2024 /2025 season with a surplus of approximately \$54,000. A comprehensive report for the year will be provided by the Treasurer.

Even though this sounds like a reasonable amount of money, the club must be aware that in a few years the club will have to bear the cost of recoating the hard courts, ongoing maintenance on the building, the increasing costs to maintain the grass courts and replacements regarding infrastructure.

Sponsorship has been a good area for support, but that in monetary value will be less next year as two of our major sponsors have paid in advance of their contracts. Toyota sponsorship is 5 years at \$5,000 per year a total \$25,000 (plus gst). Muir Marine's sponsorship is 3 years at \$3,000 per year a total of \$9,000 (plus gst). All this money has been banked within the 2024-25 financial year. Having said that BTC is very fortunate to have such strong and ongoing support and thank all our sponsors for their generosity.









Tournaments

Once again BTC ran two very successful tournaments during the season, the Junior Tournament in January and the March Tournament. Both events are very valuable to the club both financially and enhancing the Club's profile.

The March tournament was nominated for the best tournament in WA and at the time of writing this report we are in the final and will know the result on the 9th of May. Thanks to Peter Maccora for submitting a very comprehensive report for the Award.

At this stage, there is potentially another tournament that would be held in late January, Country Week. At this stage it depends on numbers. (contd. Page 13)

Pickleball

Pickleball started up quite slowly at BTC last year, but this year numbers of participants have increased quite considerably with 177 registered players. Infrastructure/Court Maintenance Reports 2024-25

Throughout the past year, I've had the privilege of working alongside the Busselton Tennis Club Management Committee and dedicated club members to ensure our facilities remain among the finest in the region. I now provide the following report, outlining the infrastructure projects and ongoing maintenance activities undertaken throughout 2024–25.

1. Court Maintenance and Condition - The A Team

The Busselton Tennis Club continues to uphold an exceptional standard in grass court maintenance, with our playing surfaces consistently drawing praise from visitors, players, and tournament officials alike.

Our club is widely recognised for having **the best grass courts in the state**, a testament to the dedication and expertise of **Chris Ashton**, our highly respected Court Curator. Under Chris' leadership, the **A Team** of



volunteers has worked tirelessly throughout the year, week in and week out, to maintain the integrity, safety, and presentation of our grass courts.

Their attention to detail and year-round commitment ensures all courts are always in premium condition for social play, club competitions, and the various tournaments we proudly host.

2. External Building Maintenance and Gardens - The B Team

The **B Team**, led largely by **Dennis Schram**, has been instrumental in keeping the club's external presentation neat, safe, and inviting. This small but mighty group meets regularly throughout the year, working diligently to complete a range of tasks including:

- General garden maintenance and pruning,
- Cleaning and upkeep of outdoor furniture and the barbecue area,
- Repairs to fencing, taps, and internal/external fixtures,
- Verandah cleaning and minor touch-ups.

Their work significantly contributes to the warm, well-maintained appearance of the club, something often remarked upon by visitors and members alike.

3. Installation of External Blinds

In response to member/Coach feedback and to enhance the comfort and usability of the club's verandah areas, **two major external blind installations** were completed during the year:

- Western Side Verandah Blinds: A set of custom-made outdoor blinds was installed along the western side
 of the clubhouse verandah. These blinds provide much-needed protection from the afternoon sun and
 prevailing winds, improving the experience for members and their families during social and competitive
 events.
- **Eastern Side Blind near BBQ Area**: An additional blind was installed on the eastern side of the clubhouse, adjacent to the BBQ area. This has made the space significantly more user-friendly during windy conditions, while enhancing the enjoyment of these facilities.

Both projects have been warmly received by members and guests and have noticeably increased the versatility and comfort of the clubhouse surrounds year-round.

4. Building Verandah Steelwork – Repairs Required

One of the more pressing infrastructure concerns this year has been the deteriorating condition of the **verandah steel poles and bargeboards**, particularly the **poor-quality paintwork**.

This issue has been **formally raised with the City of Busselton (CoB)**, as the building falls under their ownership and responsibility. Dialogue remains ongoing, and a **formal submission** has been made requesting that the CoB undertake **remedial works at their expense** to address the peeling paint and ensure aesthetic quality of the verandah is preserved. We await further advice from the CoB and will continue to liaise with them until the matter is resolved satisfactorily.



Court Maintenance Report 2024-25

As we come to the close of the main playing season, I'm very pleased to report that the courts this season held up well through winter last year and up until now. Working with the weather conditions, soil analysis and regulating the watering schedule on a firm basis have all contributed to our sound grass courts.

This season I tried a few different actions to preserve the courts and make them last longer and to bounce back faster after heavy foot traffic from tournaments as well as regular social play. This flexibility proved to be a success.



The policing of correct footwear has also been a contributing factor and resulted in protecting the grass courts from being torn up by cross trainers and the likes.

The need for insect and fungus control application has been less this year due to the healthier courts.

A massive thankyou to the A -Team lads for the continued support and maintenance they provide across the courts.

With the approach of winter, the courts will be carefully monitored, reducing the number of courts available for play as we are now losing ground temperature rapidly, resulting in poor growth and grass plant rejuvenation.

NOTE: I have found some nets overtightened to the point there is no thread left on the winders, or the net post has been turned on an angle for more tension on the nets. People must stop this practice as it stretches the cables, ripping the tape on the nets and straining the bed logs sending the post in on an angle. So PLEASE stop it, it's obvious in my eyes you don't care

Coaching initiatives and development plans 2025:


- Continue to coincide Hot Shot's Red session prior to Have a hit Friday, offering an open invite to build family participation and engagement with the club community.

Membership Report 2024-25

Overall, there has been an increase in the total membership levels for this year. This increase can be attributed to the number of Pickleball players who have joined as social members. There has also been a steady increase in Junior members, resulting from the success of club 'Have a Hit Friday' afternoon sessions.

Membership numbers are as follows,

Gold Members 107 with 58 electing to use the volunteer option (120 in 2023-24)

Silver Members 63 with 34 volunteers (21 Silver in 2023-24)

Junior Members 78 (21 Junior in 2023-24)

Social Members 77 (25 Social in 2023-24)

Life Members 8 (6 Life on 2023-24)

Of our Gold and Silver members, over 50% have used the discount option and volunteered their time at the club. Many thanks again go to Rob Lennox who has been the Co-Ordinator for the volunteers and making them aware of upcoming club events which require volunteer help.

Senior player numbers for this year are 170, compared to last year when they were 178. The Bronze level of membership was not offered this year which has increased the Silver membership levels for this year.

The Junior members show an increase of 19 players from last year. Since last year, Social membership has increased by more than 300%. From 25 Social membership to 77.

The total club membership for 2024-25 is 333 (268 in 2023-24). With this in mind, and with the growing popularity of Pickleball, the club will probably need to look at separating the social members from Pickleball players and offering a specific membership for these players.

The gross income for the 12 months was \$64,000 Expenses \$37,000 Net Profit \$27,000

The above figures are up on the 2023 / 2024 season by around 50% in profit largely due to the increase of functions held at the B.T.C.

The club's best day is Thursday with scroungers and the Thursday night players who have increased in numbers. For a number of weeks there has been a very good income from Have a Hit on Fridays with the parents and friends coming to the club to enjoy the social activity.

Saturday is going Ok, but I think that is has tapered off a little. The March Tournament of course is still very strong for the bar. The bar ran smoothly



during the year, and I would like to thank all the bar staff that helped during the year and hopefully will remain involved in the coming year.

In January 2026 the club will host the Country Week Tournament if it reaches fruition so that will be beneficial to the bar.

Our P&L for this period shows we had a gross profit of \$280,566 with expenses of \$215,208 which gives us a net profit of \$79,307.

It should be noted that approximately \$25,000 of this profit is sponsorship paid in advance for the next 3 to 5 years.

Our investments have increased with interest of \$9,815 to \$266,390 and our total banking has increased from \$312,161 last year to \$363,245 this financial year.

Fixed assets are up \$17,687 due the purchase of new nets, compressor, bar fridges and external blinds.

Long Term Liabilities (loan 220) have decreased by \$7,279.

Total Equity for the year increased from last year's \$334,861 to \$414,168 which gives us a Current Year Earnings of \$79,307.

Overall, the club has had a good year with income increasing but expenses also increasing leaving us with a Net Profit about the same as last year. \$79,307.


